

Cumberland's Culloden Army 1745-46: Men-at-Arms 483

Cumberland's Culloden Army 1745–46 (Men-at-Arms Book 483)



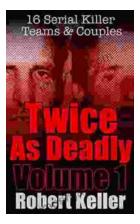

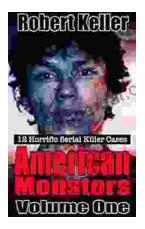
