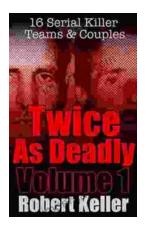

Korean War Gr. 5-8 by William Bonk

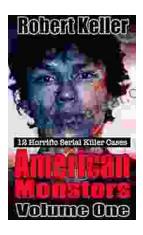
